

Know what's new for 2020.

- Parent or guardian must remain at practices and games We will need volunteers!
- Required wellness confirmation from parents before each practice and game The league reserves the right to check temperatures prior to practice and games.
- Revised seating for players and families
- No more than two players in the dug out at the same time
- Reserved parking for at-risk visitors
- Digital tools to communicate (apps)
- Staggered schedules to reduce crowd size and allow for distance
- No catcher position for TBALL and Machine Pitch
- No sharing bats, gloves, helmets, etc. Bring your own gear!
- Multiple sets of baseballs to allow for sanitization between innings
- Required masks when in close proximity to players
- Distanced pre-game and end-of-game sportsmanship acknowledgements *Tip caps instead of shaking hands at the end of each game.*
- Umpire positioning farther back from home plate or at the pitching mound, depending on division

Be prepared and follow the guidelines.

NOW!

- Get your own helmet, glove, bat, water bottle and hand sanitizer.
- Label EVERYTHING with your name and a cell phone number.
- Update your availability on the GameChanger app.

Majors and minors players who are CATCHERS: If you have your own gear – please let your coach know!

Two weeks before each game and practice

Update your availability on the GameChanger app.

One day before each game and practice

- Gather your gear.
- Make sure you have plenty of hand sanitizer.
- Re-confirm your participation on the GameChanger app.

Day of game or practice

- Parents, players, and anyone visiting must complete a wellness check, including temperature.
- Do not come to the fields if you are exhibiting symptoms or have had a fever of 100.4 or greater in the last 24 hours!
- Check in with your manager/coach and confirm you completed the wellness check at home.

Support our players and the league.

Coaches and managers will work with team parents to assign the following roles for each practice and game. All BPALL coaches are volunteers, please help and support them as they work to keep our players safe!

On Field

Safety Coordinators (3 – 5 per team)

- Multiple parents to help with drills and keeping of social distance; head coach to provide direction
- A parent to sanitize balls and catching gear

Field Maintenance

- Set up for drills
- Lead players and parents in field raking and clean up post practice / games

Off Field

Safety Coordinator

Help check temperatures for children at the start of practice / games, set up bags 6 feet apart and stay socially distant on bench; when taking breaks and when sanitizing hands

Trash Duty – Carry In / Carry Out

Each team will receive trash bags, please clean up after every practice and game and place bags in dumpster or take home.

Follow the practice guidelines for all divisions.

Adopting the new guidelines will take patience and gentle reminders. During the first few weeks of practice, please remember to support coaches and managers as they:

- Begin to implement the new guidelines so both children and adults build the proper habits for future events
- Take a few minutes at the start and end of practice to help the players get to know one another
- Emphasize sportsmanship; positive cheering for your team is encouraged (no chants please)
- Establish measures so children gradually re-acclimate to the physical activity of the sport
- · Focus on conditioning in addition to skill building
- Break teams into small groups so drills move quickly and players are not congregating
- Provide opportunities for players to experience each position
- Remind players to frequently hydrate and sanitize hands
- Work with players and parents to address questions and concerns






Family spectator zone







Spectator zone




